

Information material, Digital Supervision in special housing during the Corona pandemic

Part 1 - Information on the intervention Camera Supervision

In May 2020, the Elderly Committee in Linköping Municipality decided to provide the opportunity to use a security camera for digital supervision in special housing for the elderly during the coronavirus pandemic.

Digital Supervision is carried out digitally using a security camera.

The purpose of Digital Supervision using a security camera is to:

- use human resources efficiently, make in-person visits when necessary.
- use available protective equipment efficiently.
- free up human resources to make these available for more comprehensive care interventions resulting from the ongoing pandemic.
- contribute to an undisturbed night's sleep as staff only makes in-person inspection visits if necessary.
- reduce the spread of infection through fewer in-person visits.
- keep you safe under the current circumstances.

How does Digital Supervision using a security camera work?

Based on your healthcare planning and needs, it is determined when and in which situations to use digital supervision. The welfare team in Linköping Municipality will install the security camera in your residence. The security camera is directed towards your bed.

The staff working at your special housing accommodation will carry out the digital supervision at agreed times and in agreed situations. The appointments are approximate times. If you are not visible in the security camera's monitoring area or if the staff sees that you are in need of support and help, staff will take action as agreed.

Information on the security camera: to give the security camera a larger monitoring area, it can rotate 180 degrees in either direction. The security camera turns away/upwards when no one is watching you.

You always have the right to actively oppose security cameras and decline a security camera. In that case, your needs will be met in other ways. If you have any questions/requests, please contact your special housing accommodation.

Part 2 - Information on the personal data processing resulting from Camera Supervision

You have Camera Supervision, which is why you have received a sign stating that there is a security camera in your home. It is important that your sign is placed so that visitors can see that you have a security camera. In addition to the sign, we also provide this information, which you are entitled to according to the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

Camera Supervision means that your personal data will be processed by the Elderly Committee in Linköping Municipality. Your personal data is processed, among other things, to contribute to an undisturbed night's sleep and to reduce the spread of infection. Personal data processing is carried out for public health reasons during the coronavirus pandemic to protect relevant risk groups. The lawful basis for the processing of personal data is public interest.

The images from the security camera are not saved and no audio recording is made. Only authorised staff at your special housing accommodation can carry out the digital supervision. Upon Linköping Municipality's request, the supplier may carry out supervision in connection with troubleshooting. The supplier does not carry out supervision at other times.

The General Data Protection Regulation affords you a number of rights. You have the right to contact us if you want information about the personal data we process about you. You can also contact us to request rectification, to request that we restrict the processing, to object, or to request the erasure of your personal data.

You also have the right to file a complaint with the supervisory authority, the Swedish Authority for Privacy Protection (IMY).
