









Key lessons

- Needs of a specific target group
- Personalized/tailored program
- Interactive/co-creation design
- Critical role of mentors (three well-functioning different types)
- Common activities/planning support
- Flexible menu of options for beneficiary activities
- Informal/formal methodology depend on target group/individuals
- Finance support for mentors
- Balance cultural/social labour market interaction.
- Exit/next step guidence
- Mainstreaming challenges
- Measuring integration is a problem



Facts about PRIME

- Sustainable cross border network created
- Mapping of the needs/barriers/gaps faced by young migrants in a baseline study
- 1 Joint Young Migrants Training Programme developed with a range of options
- Piloting of the programme with 29 young migrants in Sweden and 40 young migrants in Latvia
- More than 10 times of training and mentoring with 28 mentors in Sweden.
 In Latvia 30 mentors were recruited and 719 hours provided
